How do I find a job as an International Student?

Employment options for students with an F-1 Visa

On-Campus Employment

International students can work on-campus up to 20 hours per week during the fall and spring semester, and greater than 20 hours during the summer and winter break.

Curricular Practical Training (CPT)

 International students who meet eligibility requirements can apply for CPT authorization to do an off-campus internship that is directly related to their major.

Optional Practical Training (OPT)

 OPT is a year of employment authorization after graduation for international student to gain experience directly related to their major

STEM Extension of OPT

 Students with a STEM major, currently on OPT who meet certain additional requirements can apply for an extra 2 years of work authorization.
